



Proposition 101 – How will it affect your community?

Proposition 101 will eliminate major funding sources across Colorado for schools, roads, bridges, and other critical needs.

Prop 101 will drastically reduce all public services by cutting a wide range of state and local taxes and fees. The State General Fund would lose \$1.7 billion per year and local governments would lose \$622 million per year.

Our state would lose more than \$2 Billion per year!

- ✓ Public School funding in Denver would be cut by more than 46%
 - ✓ All road budgets would be cut by hundreds of millions of dollars, meaning more potholes and crumbling bridges.
 - ✓ Such a drastic reduction would mean even more cuts in critical state services.

- **Vehicle purchase taxes will be reduced by 98%. Half of this revenue goes to fund public schools.**
 - **Vehicle registration fees will be reduced to 1919 levels! Most of this revenue goes to support maintenance and building of roads and bridges.**
 - **Taxes on rental vehicles will be eliminated. These are taxes often paid by tourists.**
 - **State income tax revenue will be cut by 25% over time. This is the main way that the state funds education health care and human services.**
 - **Over 40% of income tax goes to fund public schools.**
 - **Significantly reduce telecommunications fees. These fees provide telephone services to rural areas and low income and disabled communities.**

Proposition 101 will jeopardize the state and local governments' ability to provide essential public services by significantly reducing fees that go primarily to K-12 education, transportation, and local governments.
